

OverDrive -- Read, Listen, Watch, Enjoy

One app, thousands of eBooks, audiobooks, and videos from your local library

E-readers are one of many people's favorite gadgets. You can store your entire digital library of books and magazines on something that can comfortably fit in your purse or backpack. Would you have believed that was possible just 10 years ago? One problem with e-readers is finding great e-books to download. Sure, there are plenty of best-selling e-books on the market, but those can get expensive -- fast. With a paper book, you could always borrow or swap copies of good books with a friend. E-books aren't quite that easy to lend, and you don't want to lend your entire e-reader to someone else. You might never see it again! There are other ways to borrow and lend e-books. The best part is that they're free.

Overdrive: Let's start with the traditional place to borrow books: the library. Pleasanton, Dublin and Livermore libraries all offer e-books through a service called OverDrive. OverDrive is a company that works with publishers, libraries and schools to distribute e-books, audio books, music and video. You do have to have a library card or account at each library you would like to borrow books from.

The great part is you can use the OverDrive site to find what library has the e-book you want, or what your local libraries have to offer. OverDrive is available for almost every digital gadget, including computers and smartphones and tablets.

Read eBooks.

Best-selling authors. New release titles. Classics and crowd-pleasers. Your local public library's digital collection has it all. Find your next book and start reading.

Listen to audiobooks.

Enjoy your favorite audiobooks in the mobile app, or on your computer. Our desktop app supports transfer to a variety of devices and in many cases, burning to CD for listening on the road.

Watch video.

Choose from a large collection of movies and TV shows. Borrow feature films, comedies, documentaries, children's favorites, and more from within the mobile app.
(on Android and iOS only).

Quick access to app features

Easy to find menus make all app features, including your bookshelf, library websites, and bookmarks just a swipe or tap away.

Sync across devices

Sync bookmarks and libraries across multiple Android, iOS, and Windows 8 phones and tablets.

Own the reading experience

Change font size, margin, contrast and more to suit your style.

Variable-Speed Playback

Change audiobook playback speed from 1/2 speed (.5x) to double speed (2x).

Get the app.

Available for iPhone, iPad, Android, Chromebook, Windows Phone, Windows 8, Kindle Fire HD, and NOOK® HD/HD+.

How to get started

- A. Install OverDrive App on your Tablet (Android or Apple), SmartPhone, PC, etc.
- B. Create an account. You will need an email address and your library account numbers
- C. Start looking for books using the app.

Finding Books/Audios/Videos

1. Start the app and choose the category you are interested in (books, audio, etc./fiction, non-fiction, etc.
2. Choose the language.
3. Choose All Titles or Available Now. Under All Titles you will be able to put the book on hold if it isn't currently available.
4. Select the book you want
5. Click/Touch on "more" to read more about the book. Double check that it is in the language you want.
6. Click/Touch the Borrow button to start the borrowing process. Check the lending period to the period you want. 14 days is the default.
7. Click/Touch the Download button.
8. Choose the Format. Kindle is the easiest but you need to have downloaded the Kindle app (free) to use it and an Amazon account. You will be able to manage your borrowed books through you Amazon account.
9. Click/Touch Confirm & Download
10. Choose the "Deliver To:" device (iPad, etc.)
11. Click/Touch "Get Library Book"

Notes:

- a. Books will download to your device or to the Cloud. If it goes to the Cloud, you will need Wi-Fi to read it. If it downloads to your device, you can read it anywhere.
- b. Different libraries have different limits, e.g. Pleasanton allows 8 books on loan, Livermore 5
