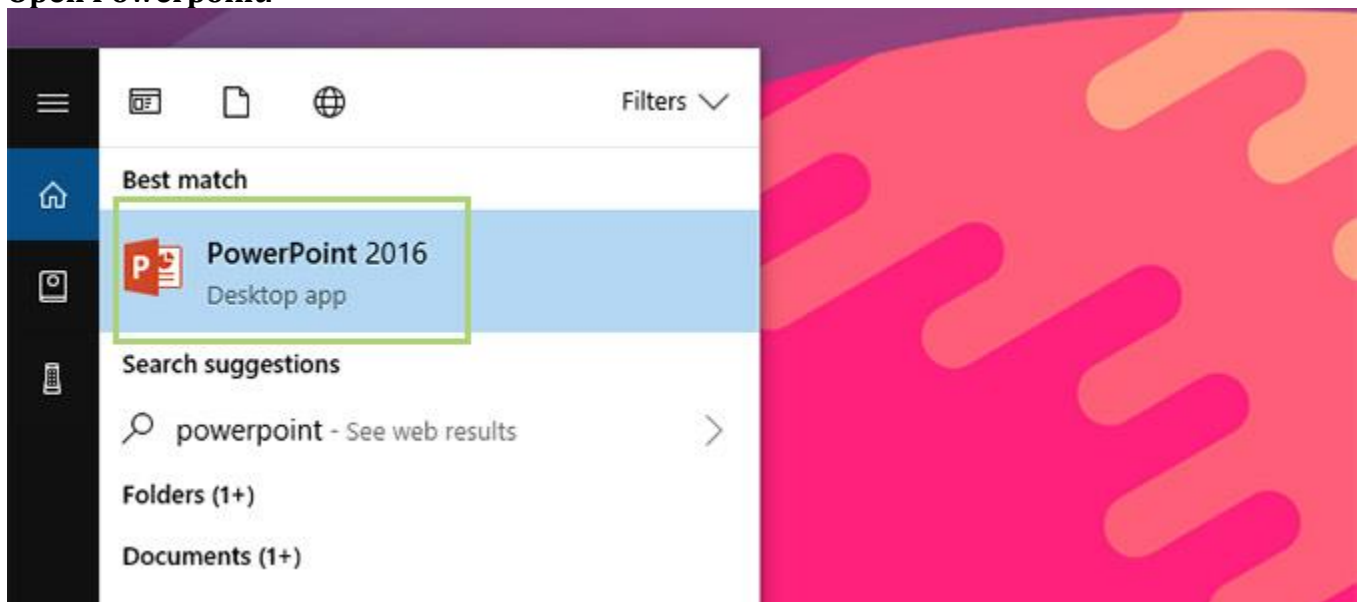

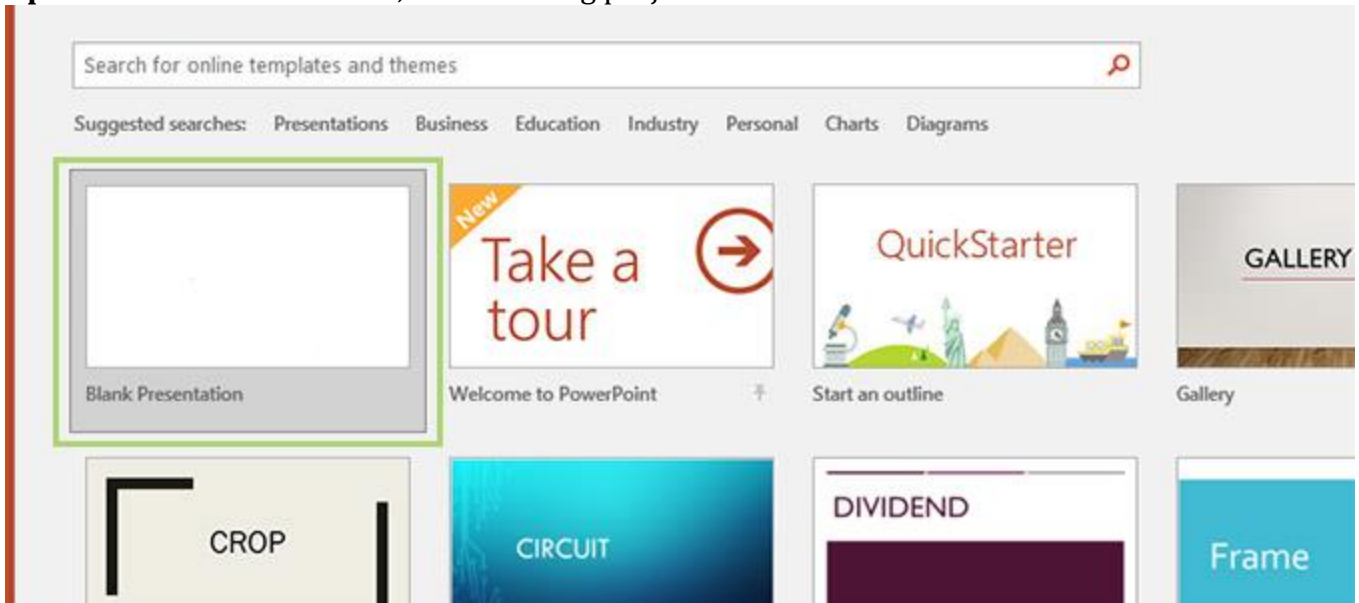
Of all

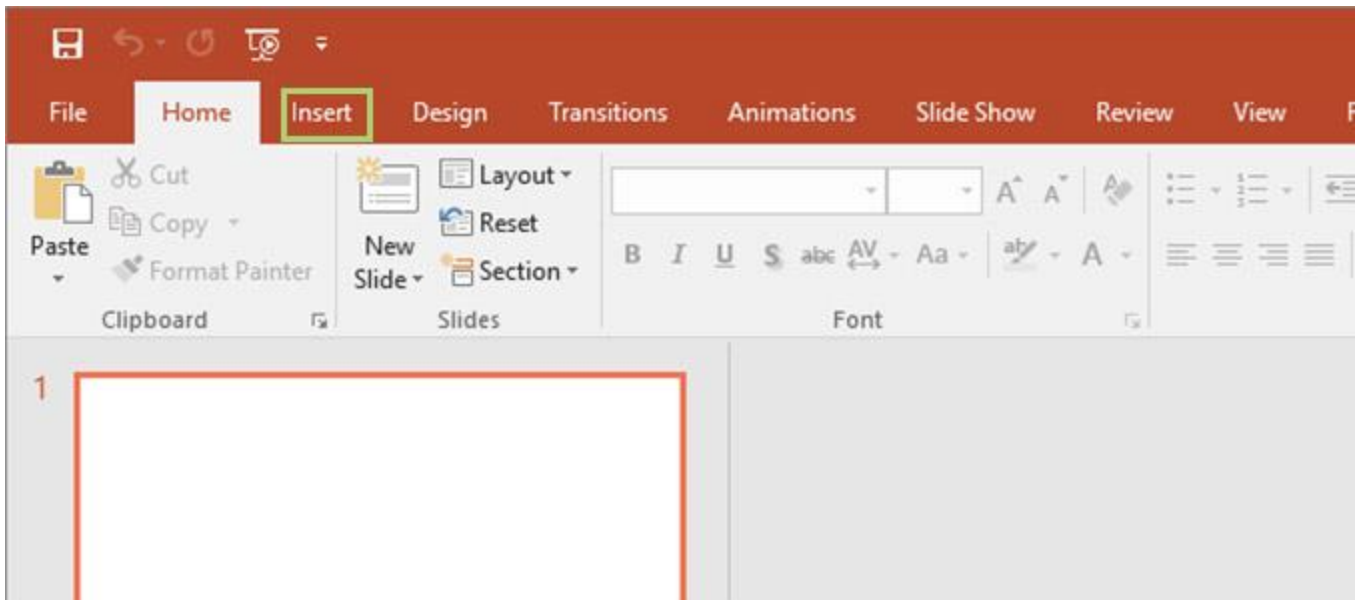
1. Open Powerpoint.



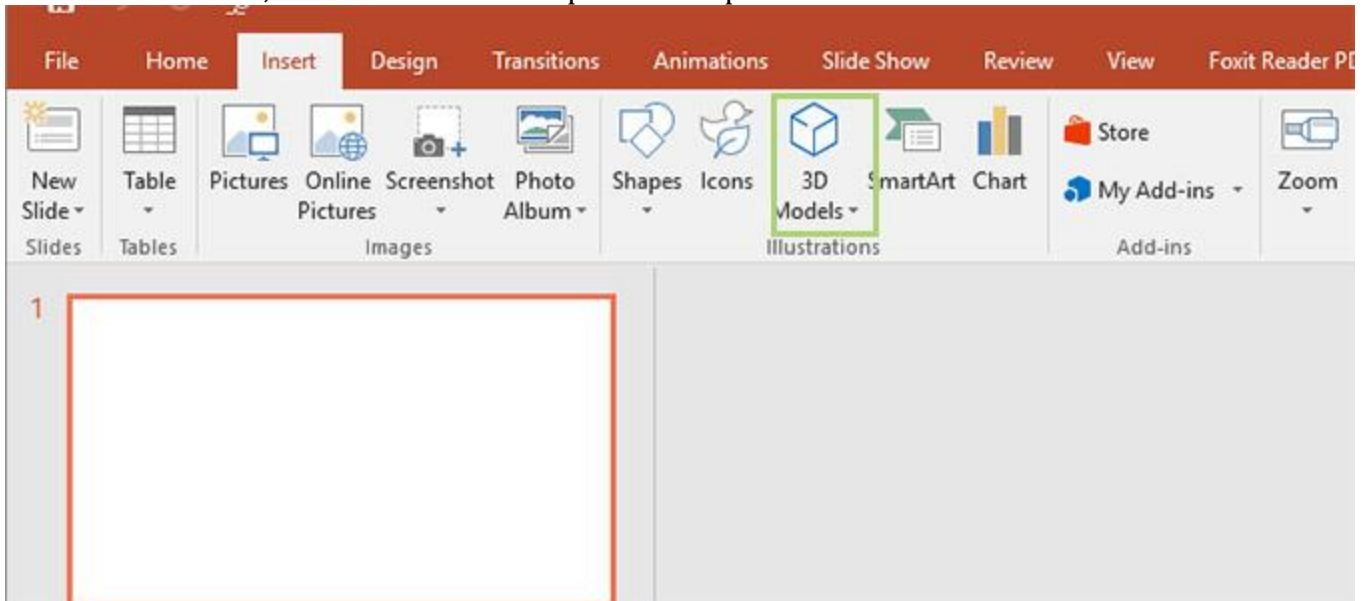
2. **Open a Blank Presentation**, or an existing project.



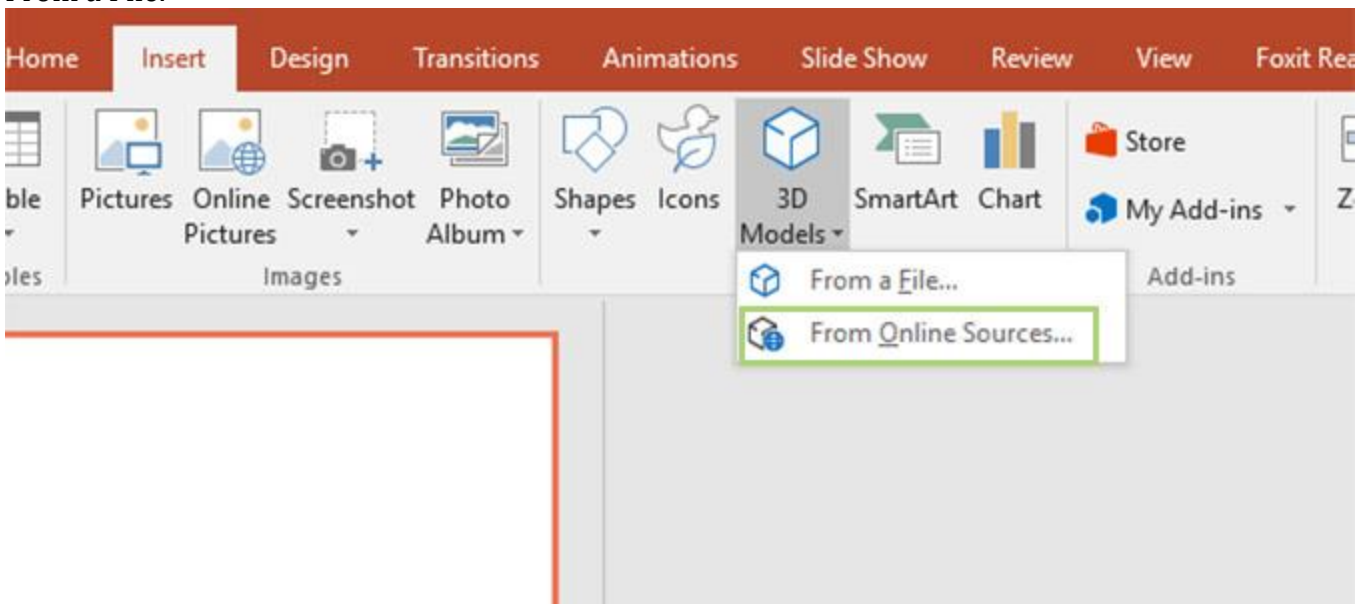
3. **click Insert** to switch tabs.



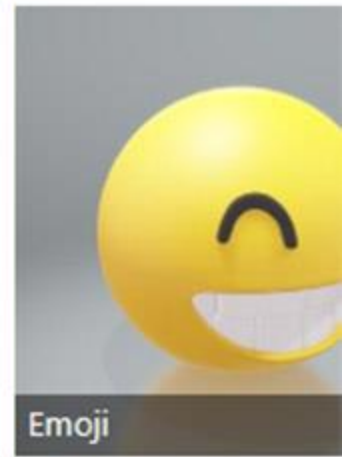
4. Under Illustrations, **click 3D Models** to open the dropdown menu.



5. **Select From an Online Source.** Alternatively, you can select to import your own artwork by choosing From a File.



6. Choose a category, or search for the item you'd like in the search bar at the top.



7. Double-click the item you want to insert into Powerpoint.



8. **Edit the size, orientation, or position** by clicking the object and moving or dragging the handles.
